

Teaching Assistant Professor in Entomology

The Department of Entomology in the College of Food, Agriculture and Natural Resources (CFANS) at the University of Minnesota is seeking applicants for a 9-month, non-tenure track Teaching Assistant Professor position. The position is a full-time, annually renewable appointment based on performance and availability of funding.

Responsibilities: Development and innovative delivery of new high-enrollment courses (in person and online) and of existing courses in Entomology to undergraduate students across disciplines, and other responsibilities such as participation in graduate teaching, undergraduate student advising, etc. as needed.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS: PhD. or equivalent degree in Entomology or a closely related field at the time the appointment begins. Experience with college/university teaching in Entomology or a related field.

PREFERRED QUALIFICATIONS: Evidence of effective teaching, experience working with diverse teams and students from different cultures and backgrounds, experience with curriculum development, experience with development and delivery of online courses.

DEADLINE: Application screening will begin on October 8, 2018 and continue until the position is filled. Expected start date is January 2, 2019.
